Event raises money for cancer

NAMPA — An event at CWI Wednesday to benefit childhood cancer research was larger than expected and raised more than double the original goal.

At the St. Baldrick's Foundation event, 32 people, including four women, volunteered to have their heads shaved to raise money and awareness for childhood cancer. The event raised more than \$3,200 eclipsing the goal of \$1,500 set by CWI's student government.

"I think we are all amazed that we doubled our goal," event organizer Kelsey Fisher said.

She said she hopes the event will continue to become bigger and more successful each year.
